The Giant Anteater in Great Iberá Park

By Federico Marconi

Introduction

Giant anteaters are insectivorous mammals native to Central and South America.

In Corrientes, these animals live in Rincón del Socorro, in the Iberá Wetlands. They are adorable and cute.

They have got a very long snout (it is their nose) and a long sticky tongue, that is about 60 cm. long. Anteaters love eating ants and termites. They have not got any teeth. They have got small eyes. They cannot see clearly, but they can smell perfectly well. Anteaters are also good swimmers, using their long snouts as a snorkel. They have got tubular heads (long, like tubes) and furry tails. They have got four legs with long sharp claws. They have got white and grey fur.

Methods

The Great Iberá Park is home to many endangered species of animals like the Pampas deer, the Marsh deer, the Maned wolf, the Crowned eagle, the Giant river otter, the Strange-tailed tyrant, the Red-and-green macaw, and the Giant anteater. All of these live on the Great Iberá vast grasslands. The Reintroduction Programme rescues anteaters and other animals taken by hunters and by people who keep them as pets in this part of Argentina. Biologists and veterinarians who work for this programme take care of them in the province of Corrientes.

Results

Today, more than 200 anteaters live free in the Iberá Wetlands National Park under a rewilding project. They are safe there.
